

are welcome. A big thank you to Sally Stumberg who organizes this group and keeps it up and running! Thanks Sally!



'I Am Coming to You'

In John 14:18 we hear the words Jesus shared with the disciples at the Last Supper: "I am coming to you."

"I am coming to you" — words meant to inspire comfort, reassurance; for with these words, we know Jesus will always be at our side. This is the hope and inspiration that carries us forward and is fundamental to our faith.

It is important to talk about instilling this faith, this understanding — this assurance — from an early age. The Pentecost Offering helps our young people begin life with a strong start, a solid foundation of faith formed in the years from childhood through young adulthood that will last a lifetime.

Through our gifts, we are able to tell the story of our God, who is always there for us, coming to us.

The Offering supports partners like the *Educate a Child, Transform the World* initiative, which seeks to equip, connect and improve the quality of public education.

It also supports the Presbyterian Youth Triennium, which gathers high school age young people for an event every three years focused on worship, disciple making, Christian compassion and justice, and biblical/theological education.

It enables young adults to share Christ's light while living in solidarity with those on the margins of society and preparing themselves for a life of service through the Young Adult Volunteer program.

Forty percent of the funds we receive will remain right here with our congregation to support our Youth Group. The remaining 60% will be used to support children at risk, youth and young adults through ministries of the Presbyterian Mission Agency. Our gifts, large and small, make a difference.

Over the past few weeks, you may have heard stories from those who have come to know the inescapable loving presence of God through transformational experiences, made possible, in part, through the Pentecost Offering.

One story is that of Maggie Collins, a Young Adult Volunteer whose strong commitment to the church's role in advocating for peace placed her at the Presbyterian Ministry at the United Nations. She says, "When donors give generously to the Pentecost Offering, it proves that our church and its members really want to empower young people and bring them into the church. It goes beyond just words and sends a message to young people we would like them to be a part of it."

Our gifts, when combined with those from other congregations, help instill in our young people a heartfelt understanding of the ways God comes to us every single day. Please give generously ... for when we all do a little, it adds up to a lot!

Pastor Transition -- May Update from the Pastor Transition Task Force

Since the April update we have completed our twelve-week, Sunday mornings mission discernment series. A final wrap-up meeting was held on April 14 to summarize the main findings. Over the course of this series there have been over two dozen different individuals that have attended one or more of the meetings with a weekly average of twelve to fifteen participants. The Session is thankful for the committed engagement that the participants applied to this work and the obvious hope and excitement it has generated.

The following week, at its regular April meeting, the Session appointed a Mission Team that will use these findings to create a written report that articulates how we understand God to be calling our congregation to ministry in the coming years, as well as clarifying the pastoral leadership we need to answer God's call. This report is called a Mission Study. The six members of this team are Ruth Smith (moderator), Nancy Brakeman, Beverly Butler, Kenda Carey, Greg Southard, and Paul York. An initial meeting was held on April 28 with the Pastor Transition Task Force (PTTF) to brief the team on its work. A first draft of their Mission Study report is anticipated by the end of May. When it is ready for review, the report will be presented to the congregation for its feedback and the final version must be approved by our Session before it is submitted to the Presbytery's Commission on Ministry (COM) for its review and approval.

We continue to be in regular contact with our two COM Representatives and met with them again in April to make more progress on our transition plan. Our agenda included making provisions for a temporary Moderator of Session while we are without an installed pastor, finding PCUSA sources and others for local demographic data that will be needed for our mission report, and details of the process to end our pastoral call with Rev. Ronnie. A necessary step at the end of a pastor's call is to hold a congregational vote to "dissolve the pastoral relationship." This vote must take place at a congregational meeting that is moderated by a pastor from the Presbytery. Back in February at the church officers retreat, we invited Rev. Ryan Landino, our Presbytery Leader, to be our guest preacher on May 5th along with Rev. Ronnie for the purpose of getting to know each other better. The Session has decided that rather than wait until Ronnie's last Sunday to hold this congregational vote, we would take advantage of Rev. Landino's presence to officiate this vote on May 5th, so a congregational meeting has been called for this date.

As you have heard, our pastor transition plan includes using guest preachers through most of the summer as has been our practice when Rev. Ronnie has been on vacation. These pulpit supply preachers have already been scheduled into July. Pastors Stephen Schwander, Nichole Torbitzky of Lindenwood, and Christi Tennyson who was recently with Presbyterian Children's Homes, have each agreed to preach at least twice for us. We can look forward to seeing some other familiar faces as well as some new ones this summer.

The Session expects our Pastor Nominating Committee (PNC) to be put in place this summer. It is the Session's responsibility to nominate those who will be on the PNC and then the actual serving members will be voted on by the congregation at a congregational meeting. As with all congregational meetings there will be a two-Sunday advance notice of this meeting.

Once again, please keep Ronnie and Margaret, our church, our Session, our Mission Team, and us—the Pastor Transition Task Force—in your prayers.
